


LOTUS 2022 Annual Report

Over the course of a year, LOTUS staff, board members, and key community stakeholders worked together to provide input and feedback that guided the creation of a new ambitious strategic plan that will guide LOTUS through the next several years to increase our mission impact. I look forward to working with our brilliant and dedicated staff as they continue to increase access to justice for Wisconsin survivors of human trafficking and sexual violence; to working with the dedicated leadership of our Board; and lastly, to working collaboratively with survivors, partners, and donors to build upon our capacity in a sustainable and intentional way.

I am so proud of the work accomplished at LOTUS each day, from securing life-stabilizing immigration protections for survivors of human trafficking, to advocating for safety and protection in court proceedings on behalf of victims of sexual violence, and to creating safe and therapeutic spaces for survivors to build community and engage in writing and artistic expression. Our Mission:

LOTUS Legal Clinic invests in survivors of human trafficking and sexual violence by innovatively blending comprehensive civil legal services, victims' rights representation, and therapeutic arts programming that results in survivor-driven justice, healing, and systemic change.

Our Vision:


An expansive community of empowered survivors whose rights are always honored, whose voices are uplifted, and whose pathways to justice and healing are equitable and self-determined.

2022 Legal Services Impact

- > LOTUS attorneys were successful in assisting 13 survivors in gaining vital immigration protections with access to work authorization.
- ➤ LOTUS filed a discrimination complaint with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) on behalf of two immigrant women farmworkers which led to a federal discrimination lawsuit and settlement that resulted in \$180,812.50 in damages to our clients.



- In the spring of 2022 LOTUS assisted a survivor of labor trafficking through his family reunification process, resulting in the arrival of his parents and two siblings.
- > LOTUS attorneys provided representation in five different large scale multi-victim labor trafficking cases, assisting these survivors in applying for visas and other temporary immigration benefits to create stability and protection.
- A LOTUS attorney assisted a survivor of sex trafficking in having her criminal record vacated of crimes that she was compelled to commit as a direct result of her victimization. This is an important first step for this survivor to begin her career and build the life she deserves.
- > LOTUS provided over 30 survivors of sexual violence with crime victim rights consultations and representation.



Untold Stories

Rise & Thrive



LOTUS' therapeutic arts programming continues to evolve and adapt to meet the unique needs of the communities that we serve.

- In partnership with Bader Philanthropies, LOTUS began offering short format and virtual writing workshops in 2022, greatly increasing our capacity to provide services to the survivor community.
- LOTUS provided bilingual writing support to 8 survivors of labor trafficking as they wrote their victim impact statements, increasing their ability to participate in the legal process.
- LOTUS writers were invited back to the state capitol to participate in the 2022
 National Crime Victims' Rights Week ceremony where they shared their poetry
 with an audience of legislators, advocates, and survivors.
- The 2022 Rise and Thrive Spring Concert Fundraiser was an AMAZING success
 with approximately 100 attendees supporting our writers and witnessing the
 vocal artistry of resident artist, Marielle Allschwang. This impactful event,
 which was featured on WUWM's Lake Effect and WORT Madison's "8'oclock
 Buzz", provided an invaluable opportunity to share our mission with the
 community and raised almost \$16,000 to support our direct services.
